The RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch 2025

Yes, it's that time of the year again. The RSPB are asking for your help with their Big Garden Birdwatch and it's this weekend (24th-26th January). Last year, they found that house sparrows were the number one visitor followed by blue tits and starlings. How will that change this year? If you've never done it before, here is what you do:

1) Pick a warm, comfy spot where you can see the birds in your garden

2) Watch the birds that land in your garden for an hour. You can download an RSPB guide from rspb.org.uk/birdwatch

3) Count how many of each species of bird land in your garden at any one time. For example, if you see four starlings at once and then a little while later you see two more then at the end of the hour record four starlings as your final count.

4) Go online and share your findings with the RSPB at rspb.org.uk/birdwatch

It's as easy as that! The RSPB will take the results from everyone all over the country and use them to find out how our garden birds are faring.

Composer of the Month

We are excited to introduce our new Composer of the Month initiative! Each month, we will focus on a different composer, learning about their music and how they create emotions through sound. This month, we are exploring the works of John Williams, one of the most famous modern composers. You might recognise his music from films such as Star Wars, Harry Potter, Jurassic Park, and Indiana Jones.

Why not listen to some of his music at home and discuss it with your child? Here are a few questions to spark conversation:

- How does the music make you feel?
- How does the composer achieve that feeling?

We have been learning some key musical vocabulary to help describe music:

- **Tempo:** The speed of the music
- Pitch: How high or low the notes sound
- **Dynamics:** How loud or quiet the music is
- Duration: How long or short the notes are
- Timbre: The unique sound quality of an instrument or voice
- Texture: How different musical layers are combined
- Structure: How the music is organised into different sections

We hope you enjoy exploring John Williams' music at home and sharing your thoughts with your child!

This free guide lets you know about the most prominent potential dangers associated with TikTok and offers expert advice on how to safeguard youngsters who are navigating the site.

Playtime Snacks

Key Stage 2 children are allowed to bring a snack from home to eat at playtime. Please ensure that this is either a piece of fruit or a cereal bar (nut free). Many children are taking items such as packets of crisps or sandwiches from their lunchboxes but these should be eaten at lunch, not playtime. Respect

Respect is important in our lives because it helps us develop a sense of self-worth and improves our general wellbeing. This in turn will enable us to develop healthy relationships with others and an environment where everyone feels valued and heard. As we grow, respect is a crucial life skill we need to manage our emotions and resolve conflicts peacefully.

When you respect yourself, this enables you to be open to new opportunities that will help you reach your personal goals. If you feel confident in your own worth, you are more able to recognise when others are not treating you well. Scan the QR code below to watch a video about Maslow's hierarchy of needs!

Our tips for respect:

- Listen to each other's point of view and recognise that it is OK if you do not agree with someone else's opinion.
- Try to keep discussions about the topic and not about the people who are sharing their views.
- 3. As a class, create an agreement and list the ways you would like to be respected by each other in school. You could all sign your name and pin this on the classroom door to remind you about how to be respectfull
- Create a poster about how you can show respect outside of the classroom too. Think about what you could do at home and in the community.
- Respect role-playI Practice respect by imagining how someone else might feel in different situations. Think about how actions and words might affect others.
- Talk to your friends about what makes you unique. Focus on listening to each other and embracing each other's differences.
- 7. Listen to the 'respect rap' by following the QR code and watching the video!
