Bike and Scooter Storage – An Exciting Update!



Good news for those who face the daily bike shed challenge – we're making some much-needed improvements to our bike and scooter storage, thanks to a grant from the Parish Council and support from our PTA.

Work will begin soon to remove the old, broken canopies over the bike stands, making access safer and easier. Additional bike stands will be installed

next to the old Children's Centre, and scooter racks with space for up to 60 scooters will go along the nursery railings.

While the new storage areas won't be covered, they will offer far more capacity and be much safer than the current setup. The storage won't be lockable, but our automatic gates restrict access to the bike/scooter storage during the school day. Families are welcome to use their own bike/scooter locks if they wish.

Please take all bikes and scooters home over the Easter holidays, as it is possible that work may begin during the Easter break.
