What a great week it has been in school, with a real highlight being a visit from Winter Olympian Freya Tarbit, who delivered an engaging and memorable assembly.

Freya introduced the children to the world of skeleton — racing headfirst down an icy track at speeds of over 80mph, which certainly captured everyone’s attention. She spoke about the bravery this takes, and the simple routine she uses at the start of every run: reminding herself that she is brave, she is prepared and she can do this. A message that felt relevant far beyond sport.

She also shared what sits behind success — the hard work, consistency and determination to keep going, even when things don’t go to plan. What really stood out was her honesty about competition. Freya spoke about how challenging it can be to see others achieve the goals you are working towards, but the importance of respecting that success and recognising the effort behind it. Her focus on continuing to improve, supporting others and trusting that her opportunity will come was a powerful takeaway for us all. Freya is now aiming for the 2030 Winter Olympics, and we will be cheering her on as she continues her journey.

A reminder about road safety following a near miss on Calvestone Road this week, where a vehicle attempted a three-point turn and mounted the pavement. Please take care when parking and avoid stopping near junctions or crossing points. We ask that you do not turn in the roads around school during busy drop-off and pick-up times, or directly outside the school. Allowing a little extra time, staying alert and showing patience with other road users helps keep everyone safe.

Over the next few weeks, there are some significant changes taking place in school which may occasionally affect communication. Our IT systems are migrating to the Triumph Learning Trust. This should not mean major changes for parents, aside from new contact email addresses, which we will share along with key dates. Most of this work is planned for the Easter break and we are hopeful it will run smoothly, but we appreciate your patience while this is completed.



With one week to go until Easter, it has been lovely to see the sunshine return and the field back in use. We are looking forward to making the most of our final week together before a well-earned break.

No Phone Zone!

A quick reminder that we promote a no phone zone school site. We ask parents to keep phones in pockets where possible at drop off and pick up, helping to keep the focus on those important start and end of day conversations with children. Year 5 and 6 pupils who bring phones to school do not have access to them during the day – they are stored securely in classroom safes – and should not be switched on while on the school site, unless required for medical reasons. 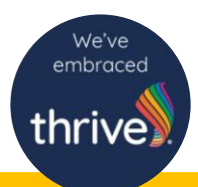
